

GIVING OPPORTUNITIES

CHARITABLE BEQUEST

The donor makes a provision within his or her Last Will & Testament. This is the simplest way to make a planned gift and the vehicle most commonly used. Gifts may include cash, securities, real estate, life insurance.

Remainder Interest

Described as 'the gift that gives back', the Charitable Remainder Trust makes it possible for the donor to make an irrevocable gift of cash or property that produces an annual income stream from the trust. Income may be fixed or variable.

GIFTS OF INCOME INTEREST

Described as 'the gift you get back', a Charitable Lead Trust allows a donor to give the income from assets placed in a trust for the donor's life or term of years, while retaining principal for the donor, heirs or a third party at the termination of the trust.

IRA GIFT

Persons over 70½ years of age may direct a gift from their qualified IRA up to \$100,000 directly to Tin Mountain. Transfers are tax free and can satisfy minimum distributions.

Life Insurance

A donor names Tin Mountain as the owner and beneficiary of a life insurance policy. Insurance payments are deductible under current law; and, will fund a significantly larger end-gift.

GIFTS OF REAL ESTATE AND PROPERTY

Real Estate comes in a variety of forms including personal residences, vacation homes, commercial property and land. Each have their own tax benefits including life use.
